We decide our own sexual identity, which may or may not match our biological sex.

In society we can find a whole range of possibilities that don't fit into the standard definition of "man" and "woman".

Our bodies are similar, but each individual also has their own particularities.

I'm a boy/girl because I know what I am, and I'm the only one who can decide what I am.

Some people think gender is a cultural issue, but I think it's a biological difference.

Heteronormativity only accepts a "natural" gender that has to match the person's biological sex.

Heteronormativity includes the distribution of male and female roles in society and in the family.

I'm a sensitive man/energetic woman, but I don't want to let it show.

Feminine boys are more harshly repressed by those around them than masculine girls.

Society excludes individuals with ambiguous sexual characteristics.
